A MINDSET OF SERVICE

There's a lot of traveling, delivering, and visiting going on in our readings today. In Genesis Abraham cares for the needs of three mysterious travelers. The psalm responds, celebrating the kind of righteousness that Abraham practices. Then, in his letter to the Colossians, Saint Paul describes his own ministry as almost like a delivery service: he, God's steward, brings the word of God to their community. Finally, Luke's Gospel shares the well-known story of Mary and Martha, and the different ways they welcome Jesus into their home. Amid all this coming and going, we are invited to pay attention to the ways we tend to the needs of others. Each of us can ask, *How am I present to God and others in my life?*

Tools like background checks, training of clergy and volunteers, sound reporting mechanisms, and outreach to victims are critical in the process of reconciliation, healing, accountability, and prevention of future acts of abuse.

The Diocese of Tyler expects all Church personnel - priests, deacons, religious, paid employees, and volunteers - to conduct their lives and ministry (whether in a parish, mission, Catholic school, or other Catholic institution or ministry) with ethics and integrity. We are committed to keeping all those served by the Church in northeast Texas safe!

Procedures: The Parish Armatus Administrator (Bridget Rich) will enter volunteers (church personnel & acolytes have completed background check & policy procedures) into the Praesidium's Armatus portal. Before you receive these two e-mails, as a courteous to you. I will notify you from Holy Spirit by e-mail or phone to let you know I'm proceeding with inputting your information into the program. Then, you will receive two e-mails: An email with instructions on how to complete the background check. The cost is \$16 per person. The cost of the background check will be billed to the parish. The volunteers are asked to pay by check (checks payable to HSCC) or cash to the church office, Bridget Rich. Then an e-mail with instructions on how to complete the on-line training component. If you have a problem there will be a phone number to call for help/support (not the church office). Once this is completed Bridget will direct you to the next available in-person Foundational Training session. There are steps being taken to have the 2.5 hour session at Holy Spirit. I will begin with our Holy Spirit Ministries such as Ems, Lectors, and Ushers, etc. *Bridget Rich*
